LIVING AND PLAYING CRICKET IN KENYA; HOW WOULD YOU COPE COPE?



David Dolman has returned from his expedition to Kenya where he and six other volunteers helped develop cricket coaching and coach education linked to an awareness campaign to prevent HIV and AID's. Based on his experience there he asks young players at Corsham Cricket Club a number of questions.

Could you

Survive on two pieces of plain bread and water for over 6 hours?

Play in temperatures of over 30 degrees?

Play in bare feet on rough dusty grounds with cattle grazing all over it?

Walk ten miles to school and back again to home each day and study in classes of over 60 pupils?

Live in a community without electricity and clean water?

Live in a Country where over 25% are HIV positive; many are orphans and thousands live rough on the streets

Keep smiling and enthusiastic about playing cricket with improvised equipment and a rock for a ball.

Welcome to Kenya!

This is the life that most young people lead. Sometimes when we complain about things we have no idea how lucky we are to live in Corsham, study in our local schools and play cricket at Corsham Cricket Club all in a clean and safe environment.

David says

'Although I was aware of poverty and deprivation in Africa I was shocked and saddened by what I saw but also inspired by the spontaneous enthusiasm of the children and teachers. The Charity I was working for coached over 1500 children and brought broad smiles to a sea of black faces over the two week period. We trained 130 new coaches to take the message of HIV and Aids into schools and local communities and to use the power of sport to help change peoples lives'.

Through this newsletter David would like to thank all of those club members and parents who donated money towards the Charity 'Cricket Without Boundaries'.

David comments

'The problems in Kenya are massive but in a small but significant way I think the volunteers made a lot of people happy and laid down some sustainable initiatives'.
